An Early Help Assessment (EHA) or Team Around the Child (TAC) means social services will be involved.

If parents approach school for help, school will refer to social services.

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The truth:

The Trust's main priority is keeping your child safe. There are many aspects that 'Safeguarding' covers including: Online safety, fire drills, non-attendance, lockdown practices, road safety. If we talk about safeguarding, it doesn't always mean social services are involved.
